When you think of God's holiness, what do you think of? Why?

What about God do you find worthy of your worship?

In what ways do you worship God in your life?

Why is God's holiness an important characteristic to recognize?

How do people tend to respond to God? How do those responses honor or dishonor His holiness?

Daily Challenges

Choose one or more to do this week.

- Set aside at least an hour to worship God in your own way. Sing worship songs; go on a hike to enjoy the beauty of God's creation; create art, any way you'd like to express your praise! Thank God just for who He is.
- Is there an area of your life where you've noticed you haven't really been living up to God's holiness? Spend time in prayer, and ask for the wisdom and strength to make the changes. Ask God to send you onto the path He has planned for you.
- What does "God is holy", mean for the way we live our lives? Take a piece of paper and write "God is holy, so..."; reflect on ways you can respond to God's holiness, by writing "I" statements. For example, "I am in awe of Him" or "I want to serve Him."

Use the following passages and questions to explore additional Biblical insights about your heart.

Monday—Exodus 15:11

What other ways can you describe holiness? Why is it that nothing can really compare to God?

Tuesday—Psalm 100:2-3

How can you worship God with gladness? What does it mean to really "know that the Lord is God"?

Wednesday—Romans 12:1

How can you be a holy, living sacrifice to God? What does worship mean based on this verse?

Thursday—Hebrews 12:14

In what ways can others see God's holiness in you? How does peace connect to holiness?

Friday—1 Chronicles 16:29

What does "the splendor of His holiness" mean? What is the glory due to God's name? How do these phrases impact your worship of God?

Saturday—Nehemiah 9:6

What other reasons can you think of that God is worthy of worship?
