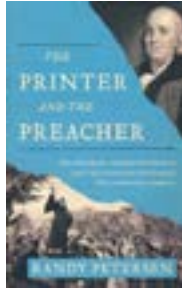

Where is Jesus' Discipling Classroom?

"Life is a classroom. So pay attention."
~ Someone who knows what they are talking about

A classroom can be anywhere. Any space can become a place of learning. Learning is literally now happening along life's way.

God has been advocating the 'learn along life's way' educational strategy for a very long time (p.123). In Deuteronomy 6:4-9, God gave the following instructions through His prophet Moses to the Israelite people: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates."

In Matthew 4:19, Jesus gives an invitation to his future disciples: "Come, follow me." Jesus' invitation is to learn from Him along life's way. With Jesus as the master teacher and mentor, any space can become a place of learning, training, and apprenticeship. With Him, our classroom can be literally anywhere. So, let's pay attention!

Jesus invites us into His immersion program. He invites us to be disciplined by Him day by day as we join Him on His redemptive mission along life's way. As we see in the gospels, Jesus regularly takes His disciples on mission in the ebb and flow of daily life, but then He also leads them to quieter places. It is here that He gives them time and space for reflection and conversation (debriefing and processing).

As Pastor Greg Finke states, "Jesus uses both kinds of classrooms. He uses the 'classroom of everyday life' to give His followers real-life experience and He uses the 'classroom of time together' for reflection and conversation so that they can sort out what they have experienced and learned" (pp.124-125).

Missional community provides a regular time for Jesus followers (like us) to step out of the busyness of everyday life and come together in a place where we can take a breather, have some time for reflection and conversation, and sort out what we are learning from Jesus on our mission adventure with Him. Gathering regularly to tell our stories and hear the stories of our friends is what keeps us encouraged, informed, focused, and accountable for living life with Jesus as a daily lifestyle (p.126).

There are a variety of ways we can engage in Missional Community:

- 1) The Family
- 2) Existing Congregational Groups
- 3) Other Missionaries in the "Neighborhood"

As we think about the ways in which we can join Christ on His mission in our everyday lives – in the classroom of everyday life and in the classroom of time together – consider these words from the book of Hebrews (10:24-25): 24 And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, 25 not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

The Dream Center in Uganda is getting a few finishing touches and will be completed soon. It will be the first community center ever in the region. They have built a computer lab, sewing room, recreation center, vocational and leadership training rooms, and a library.



The library in the Dream Center is already up and running. Can you picture the looks on the children's faces when they walk into the room filled with books that they get to not only read but check out and take home? (This is a community where most schools don't even have text books to use in their classrooms, let alone a library.)

Refurbishing the Handbells - Thank You!

Through a generous grant from Foundation of the Master, LCM's Schullmerich handbells and Suzuki hand chimes were refurbished on April 30th. Just like a car needs a full tune up every 10,000 miles or a piano needs to have regular tunings, the handbells need to be serviced so that these beautiful instruments maintain their value. Not maintaining the bells is equivalent to ignoring valuable property of the church.

The last time the bells were serviced was 7 years ago. This was done when I brought the bells out of a decade of storage. They were in desperate need of attention and the Foundation granted us the funds to have a basic service done. But, this time around a combined servicing of the bells was needed. The servicing was done by a company out of Texas called The Bellman - or men in this case. They are on the road in their MoBell Repair Van eight months out of the year servicing bells all over the continental United States. Mark Bond and his son Aaron arrived at LCM at 8 AM on April 30th to start the process.



They provided and installed any required replacement components of a friction-bearing nature on all of the handbells and polished them to perfection. They also tuned the bells so that they all blend when rung together as a choir. This was really necessary since we have added almost 2 more octaves to the existing handbells since 2015. The newer bells were pitched slightly different from the original 3 octave set and the original set of bells had never been tuned since their purchase decades ago.

The next servicing should be scheduled in April of 2025. This once again would be a basic service on all of the bells, but the original three octaves need new handguards/pins/cap screws since they have become cracked over time and should be upgraded to the same Mastertouch Disc design like the newer bells. It is also recommended that the clapper heads on the original 3 octaves be replaced. The clappers have three settings - light, medium and hard. The parts which allow these settings on the clappers to be functional are almost worn out. Also, the handchimes are coming to the end of their life expectancy so to speak. Parts are no longer available for these instruments so eventually they will have to be replaced. We also need to find another place to store the bells as where they are being stored now is not ideal. The heat off of the AV and computer equipment in the storage area is causing the springs that operate the clappers to get brittle and crack. These springs, like everything else these days, are quite expensive.



Now that I've given you a run down on everything you've ever wanted to know about LCM's handbells, I hope you have a better understanding as to why it's important to keep them at their peak performance quality and why it is truly a blessing that our church owns such a beautiful set of handbells. Thank you to all the Foundation donors who helped make the servicing of the handbells possible. Having this service completed is almost like getting a whole new set of handbells!

Stephen Ministry

Journeying through Grief is a set of four short, easy-to-read books that offer words of comfort and hope to those grieving the loss of a loved one. The books are given to grieving people at specific times during the first year after a loved one dies. Each book focuses on what the person is likely to be experiencing at that time and provides care, assurance, encouragement, and hope. Books are available for free at the church office.
